2018 Kuck Collegiate Cycling Scholarship Application

Program: The Joshua Kuck Collegiate Cycling Scholarship is a program of the USA Cycling Foundation. Scholarships are awarded to full-time students who have gone the extra mile to succeed in the areas of academics and collegiate team development, with an emphasis on cycling safety, advocacy and education in their respective communities. Two scholarships will be awarded in 2018 to the top male and female qualifying applicants in an amount of no less than \$1,500 each.

Background: Joshua Kuck came from his home state of Maine to Florida in 2005 to attend the University of South Florida in Tampa. Josh was passionate in his endeavors to found a collegiate cycling team for South Florida, and he made many friends in the process of organizing and leading the team. Josh was successful at everything he set to mind, and on the bike he proved himself a true domestique, often sacrificing his own race in order for his teammates to succeed. When touting his accomplishments it was always those of the team and not his individual success.

On October 21st, 2007 while riding a century event with his team near Tampa Bay, Josh was hit by a truck and taken from family and friends. His life ended long before he was allowed to achieve all of which he was capable. His family and team honor his memory with this scholarship fund and support the efforts of those working on cycling safety, advocacy and education projects to keep tragedies like this from taking any more of our cycling friends.

Eligibility: Applicants must be a full-time student, as determined by the institution, for the academic year 2018. The applicant must also be a U.S. Citizen, a member of a current USA Cycling Collegiate cycling club and hold a current USA Cycling Collegiate racing license.

How to Apply: Complete the following application and send to the address listed below with all supporting documents. **All applications must be received by Friday, April 20, 2018.** The scholarship recipients will be announced at the Collegiate Road National Championships on Saturday, May 5, 2018.
